Monitoring activities undertaken:

- Monitored planning, spoke to staff and children and observed worships to see the extend to which children are leading and being actively involved in worships
- Gathered Pupil voice for the children which consisted of the Collective Worship Assistants and 2 children in receipt of Pupil Premium and/or with SEND from each class
- · Updating the website to reflect the current practice in school linked to the new SIAMS framework

Findings to celebrate:

- Pupil Voice about Collective Worship was strong. When asked what they like about Collective worship these were their responses:
 - -Children appreciate CW and talk about it as exciting, relaxing and being part of something bigger
 - -CW assistants love their role and responsibility
 - -Worships via video connecting us to other schools are really enjoyed
 - -They don't like other children talking and being disrespectful
- All worships observed and talked about had pupil leading elements, writing and leading the prayer, lighting candles, helping teachers or visitors
- The worships where the children take a full lead e.g. Harvest and Class Worships are really loved and appreciated by children and families

Questions to ask:

- How can we improve the behaviour of a few to ensure worship is not disrupted for the majority?
- How can we make worship and prayer in school even more child led?
- How can we reflect our current practice in line with the new SIAMS framework via our website?

- Continue to offer the opportunity for worship beyond our school via Picture News and The Sanctuary Foundation

 Implement the look in, look up, look out framework via a CW assistants worship

- Worship to be a comfortable experience for all involved
- Worships will be even more child led which will engage more children and inspire other children to want to lead.
- Collective worships to be led by key groups for Anti-bullying so the messages will be more impactful from peers
- Children will see that their views have been listened to
- All children feel involved and 'part of the school family through a new prayer written by the school community
- Children will feel connected to the 'wider world' and have a greater sense of courageous advocacy and social justice as a result

 Children to be able to articulate where they experience spirituality in school both in the classroom and worship in planned experiences and spontaneous moments using the language of look in, look up, look out
